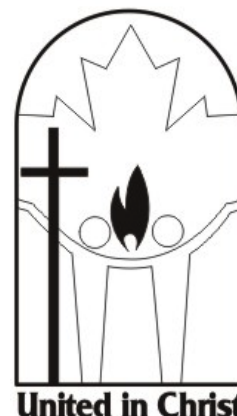


The United Brethren Church in Canada Christian Higher Education Scholarships

Scholarship Purpose:

The United Brethren Church in Canada's Christian Higher Education Scholarship fund is established to encourage and assist active committed members of its local churches who desire to pursue their post-secondary education at a fully accredited Christian university, college, seminary, or Bible College to become church leaders, pastors, missionaries, & teachers who will promote and maintain the work of the Church in their local church, in the community, and in their chosen professions. The United Brethren Church in Canada officially supports two Christian post-secondary educational institutions; Huntington University and Emmanuel Bible College.



Qualifying Schools:

An approved college, seminary, or university must be fully accredited. They must be committed to and widely recognized as schools that equip students for Christian leadership and/or ministry and basics are taught from a biblical perspective. If for any reason, a college or school or the student's attendance at the school is called into question, the onus is upon the applicant to provide proof of the school's accreditation and/or the student's acceptance and enrollment at the school. The United Brethren Church in Canada reserves the right without question to support, limit support, or refuse support for any request for any reason. All applicants will be reviewed and informed on amounts being given. Applicants may be contacted to provide additional information regarding institutions being attended, program being taken, or career intentions after school.

Ministry intent means preparing yourself for full-time vocational service within a church or para-church organization. Additional funds, as available, will be awarded to students pursuing a career as a pastor, chaplain, or missionary. Why Students Attending Huntington & Emmanuel Receive Higher Funding:

Huntington University is a United Brethren Christian Liberal Arts University. This fund is only for United Brethren students who attend Huntington University. Emmanuel Bible College is a covenant partner of The United Brethren Church in Canada. UB students receive added funding to encourage attendance at Emmanuel.

When to Apply:

Deadline for applications will typically be August 15. However, this year, that application will be extended to October 1. All applications must be emailed to ubhighered@gmail.com for consideration. Funding will normally be provided by the end of September to applicants, subject to funding availability.

In order to maximize funding, indicate all courses the applicant will be taking for the entire academic year (September 1-August 31 of the following year). Applicants will not receive funding for more than 10 courses per academic year.

Students enrolled in Huntington University in Huntington, Indiana or at Emmanuel Bible College in Kitchener, Ontario receive added financial assistance. Further financial assistance is awarded to those who pursue an education with the intent of serving vocationally in full-time Christian ministry.

How to Apply:

Application forms are available online. Talk to your pastor for details. Funding is available to support actively involved members of a local church of The United Brethren Church in Canada. The application must be completed by the person who will receive the award, verified and endorsed by the pastor of The United Brethren Church in which he/she holds membership status, and submitted to the scholarship committee via ubhighered@gmail.com. Please include a letter of acceptance or other proof of enrollment to confirm attendance at a Christian institution.

Funding Availability:

All awards are based on an academic school year, September-August of the following year. Funds are given based on courses being taken. No more than 10 courses will be covered per academic year. Additional funding requests after August 15, with the exception of this year, will be considered on a case by case basis and will be awarded as funding allows. To guarantee maximized funding, all applicants must indicate how many courses they plan on taking for that academic year, including summer courses.

How Funding is Awarded:

| Graduate Studies | \$100.00 | \$1,000.00 |

Please note, the base funding is \$125.00 per course. Attendees of Emmanuel Bible College and Huntington University will receive an additional \$125.00 or \$300.00

respectively per course. Students with ministry intention or working on a graduate degree will receive an additional \$50.00 and \$100.00 respectively per course.

Undergraduate Examples:

A student taking the max 10 courses for the school year at Tyndale with an intention for ministry will receive \$1,750.

A student taking the max 10 courses for the school year at Emmanuel Bible College with an intention for ministry will receive \$3,000.00.

A student taking the max 10 courses for the school year at Huntington University with an intention for ministry will receive \$4,750.00.

Graduate Examples:

A student taking the max 10 courses for the school year at Heritage Seminary with an intention for ministry will receive \$2,750.00.

A student taking the max 10 courses for the school year at Huntington University with an intention for ministry will receive \$5,750.00.
